From Provincial's Desk

A lot has been written and said about the recent protests against the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), National Register of Citizens (NRC), and National Population Register (NPR). There have been many contradictory statements by politicians and even by some eminent journalists. In most cases they smack of either selective understanding based on what they wish to convey or not to convey.

But the fact of the matter is that the statements of many leaders and of those who follow them have lost sight of the fundamental principles of our Constitution. The language used by a number of responsible leaders is very exclusive.

Archbishop Soosapakiam rightly says, "The Constitution includes the basics of the Gospel and hence it is the duty of every believer to protect it." Yes, our Constitution is a sacred text written with the blood of innumerable martyrs who transcended the barriers of caste, religion, region, ethnicity and language. In the context of innumerable protests, I hope sense will prevail over our leaders to consider peaceful reconciliation of conflicting interests, healthy public discourse, and respect for dissenting views at the heart of democracy.
